- Understand the realities of homelessness in the UK.
- Identify the factors that cause youth homelessness.

NEXT STEPS

FREE

Ideal for young people age 15+. We can tailor to be about moving out in general or going to university.

Aim: To prepare students for the realities of leaving home and living independently.

Learning Outcomes:

- Recognise the importance of planning before leaving home.
- Understand the estimated costs of living independently.
- Identify the steps involved in finding private rented accommodation.

SOLVE IT, RESOLVE IT

Aim: To improve understanding of conflict, help develop strategies to manage it and maintain healthy relationships.

Learning Outcomes:

- Identify the effects of my behaviour when in conflict.
- Identify a positive change I could make when in conflict.
- Understand factors that can affect communication.

TIPPING POINT

Aim: To improve understanding of anger and explore methods for managing it.

Learning Outcomes:

- Recognise things that trigger my anger.
- Identify signs that I am getting angry.
- Name at least one way I could manage my anger.

YOUR VOICE, YOUR CHOICE

Choose from the following topics: Consent, Sexting, Coercive Control, Identifying Abusive Behaviours, or Child Sexual Exploitation.

Aim: To provide vital information to help keep young people informed and safe in their intimate relationships.

Learning Outcomes:

- Identify the key elements of a healthy relationship.
- Have up to date information on current law and issues of your chosen subject.
- Be confident in applying their learning to everyday relationships.
